

## Applications Method

November 3rd 2014 I attended a Jobseeker's Commitment Interview that replaced the Jobseeker's Agreement. It was with Helen Clark.

This replaced the requirement number for applications (as many as can) and commuting time. Helen Clark commented on my being "over-qualified" when I asked if she saw anything there regarding my CV and my difficulty finding work.

She was satisfied that the provided URLs constituted proof in the jobs search. But 'they' would want evidence of emails and messages sent (as in cover notes). I said that if I did this my given seven pages of looking with URLs would be much longer, but I do put the list online.

Helen Clark advised that I should next time put them both online and print out, and then have them online only. First, however, I should check that their computers for clients would show my website and the applications listed, and this was done immediately after the interview and my listing was indeed visible.

A fortnight later on 17 November I was told that another client leaves a list of index numbers of jobs applied for in his Activity Area of the Universal Jobsmatch website. So I decided I would do this, and also add links in my Activity Area through to my listing page of URLs and messages on my website viewable on client computers.

On 1 December when I signed on I had no print-out, the index numbers were listed for the whole fortnight in my Activity Area of the Universal Jobsmatch website, and the longer list with URLs and messages was available on my website. I was not asked to show this to anyone.
